LIBRARY OPENING

The Library was closed the entire month of May.

We opened for curbside service on June 8. We were fairly busy that first Monday but things have slowed down somewhat since then and it has been very manageable. Patrons have either reserved items using the online catalog or have called to request them. It has gone very smoothly, the patrons are very appreciative for the service and there have been no complaints. Given the lack of problems with this opening we have decided to open the building to the public on Wednesday, June 17 (Phase 2 of the Preparedness and Response Plan) with all of our normal operating hours restored. This is a "soft opening" without much notice to help us get our procedures in place before we advertise our opening. We will post notices online that we are open starting Monday, June 22.

PROGRAMS

Virtual programs are being planned for the rest of June and July. We are working with the other libraries in the County to share information about these programs with all of our patrons.

STAFF

Jake and I are now working our normal hours. Laura is still not comfortable with her child care situation and is working from home. We will be able to have two volunteers in two shifts on Saturdays so we are back to a normal staff rotation of one staff member and one volunteer on duty at a time on Saturday. Laura will be able to join the regular Saturday staff rotation.

I spoke with Marie Priest's daughter and Marie is recovering well with good spirits, but her daughter does not anticipate that she will be able to return to work.

FRIENDS & VOLUNTEERS

With the opening of the building to the public we have asked several volunteers to come in to help shelve the books that have gone through the quarantine period. This will end up being one volunteer per day, four days during the week (with two on Saturday). Because of the quarantine schedule we will not need to shelve books on Wednesdays. We will keep this volunteer schedule based on our need for help. The goal is to not have too many people behind the circulation desk at one time and keep the overall number of people in the library down to allow for better social distancing.
